Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

RULES

FAILURE TO OBEY RULES WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE EXPULSION WITHOUT REFUND.

- 1. ALL CAMPERS AND GUESTS MUST REGISTER AND CHECK OUT AT THE MAIN OFFICE.
- 2. Window sticker MUST be displayed on windshield at all times
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors is forbidden.
- 4. Campfires must NEVER BE LEFT UNATTENDED.
- 5. Mopeds, ATVs, etc. ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- All vehicles must have licensed drivers, including golf carts.
- 7. DOGS must be leashed at all times and must not be left unattended. Dog litter should be disposed of in dumpsters. No dogs allowed in beach area.
- 8. QUIET TIME is from 11:00 pm to 8:00 am. 11:00 pm curfew for children.
- 9. Destroying the natural beauty of the campground is not permitted. Cutting live trees or defacing property in any way will result in a \$500 FINE.
- 10. Any site changes must be approved by Dick. Also, schedule Camperville work crew jobs in office.
